Extract from a letter, dated July y 12, received by Captain Cain from the owners of the Morayshire:-" The Morayshire is in the London Dock, and will begin to discharge immediately. She was on fire when off the Brazil coast and must have damaged some part of her cargo; at present I am not aware of the extent of the mischief done, but I hope it will not prove to be very serious.
